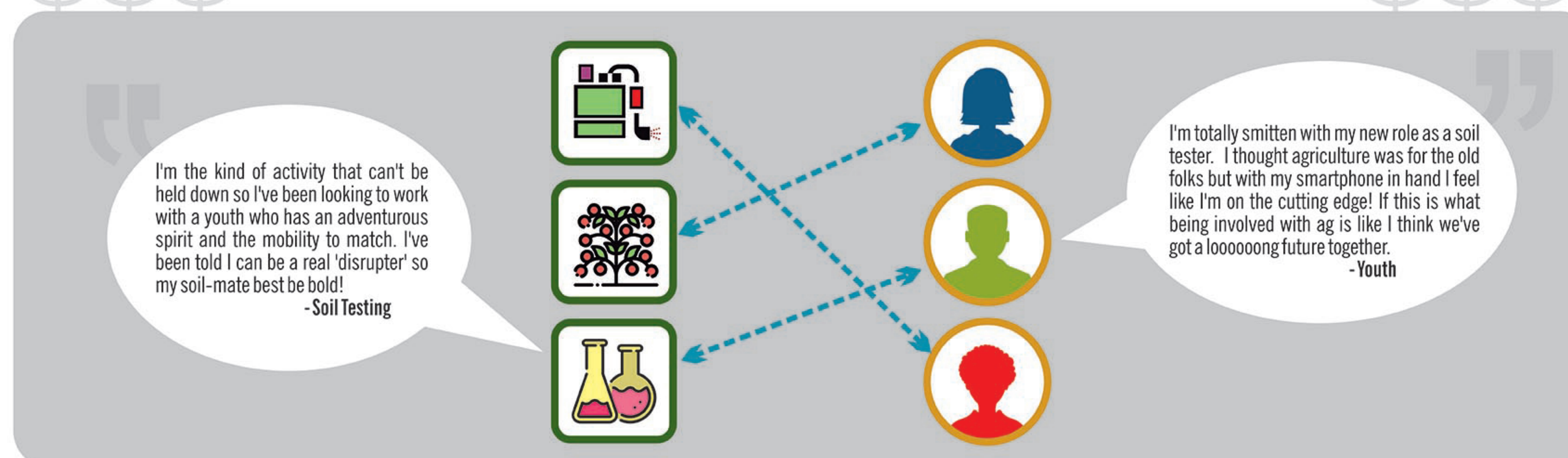
GETTING TO KNOW YOU
