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Youth-Led Qualitative Research: A Rapid Assessment Approach

In three weeks, 15 youth leaders helped by one facilitator:

- Defined the central program focus
- Outlined capacity development priorities for project partners
- Determined selection criteria guidance for new partners
- Identified assets and priorities in all (11) governorates

And:

Noticeably built capacity and fully bought in to the approach that they created



Phase II Methods:

- Key informant interviews
- Street intercept interviews
- Selected observations
- Community mapping
